I. Course Description

This course provides the experiences, skills and techniques for the examination of current issues; review of research in art and art education literature; delineation and application of an individual research problem focusing on one or more artistic media.

Internet Access: You are required to have access to the Internet to participate in certain assignments and for ongoing course participation.

III. Course Requirements and Grading Standards (Subject to Change)

- 3. Participation in class discussion is part of your grade.
- 4. Major Professor determines the level of artistic challenge selects and approves the final topic and medium and reserves judgment on final grade.

IV. Course Requirements

Task I. <u>Participation</u>

Attend class meetings on-time and contribute to class discussions.

Task II.Types of Art Work

- (a) Each student will define and describe four (4) kinds of artistic styles in each of the following categories: Figurative, Landscape, Still Life. Sources of information should be indicated.
- (b) The student will cite and locate visual evidence of two examples of each kind of art work in the above-mentioned categories (24 examples in total) providing complete bibliographical data for each work cited.

Task III Identification and Investigation of Research Concerns

- (a) After the topic is selected and approved by your major professor, each student will investigate one medium, type or theme of art work and prepare a selected bibliography of ten sound books and/or articles which pertain to this topic. Complete bibliographic data should be given for each entry: author, title of article, or study, journal, or book, volume, publisher and address, date.
- (b) Locate and read five of these books/articles in their complete form and summarize the theories of these examples in writing to be handed in.
- (c) Select an example of artists who is representative of this area of art and describe and discuss (orally) the research/creative methodology which was employed (Presentation to professor)

This collective effort will provide each person with a basic overview and materials in a selected area of artistic research.

Task IV Issues

Each person will present a written statement, commentary or essay on an issue which faces art/arts education today. Using your knowledge of current trends, state your position, philosophy and concerns in relation to an issue which is vital to your profession. The scope of the problem can be national or local, practical or theoretical. (Approximate length, 3 pages)

Task V Development of a Research Study and Master's Exhibition

(a) Each student will develop a body of art works (10-12 pieces depending on size and content) The task will include the final written double-spaced artistic statement (10 pages) which elaborates its correlation and contribution to art education today, and a one-page single-spaced abstract of the statement. The timetable for the development of the research project is given on the course schedule for the semester.

- (b) Each master's candidate must write an artistic statement and prepare a black and white photograph of yourself for the publication of the exhibition catalogue.
- (c) Digitally photograph all your artwork and sketches with high resolution and burn the images along with all other written assignments of this course onto a CD or DVD.
- (d) Each candidate will describe and defend their research study in an oral report, explaining their procedures, showing their original work and analyzing their results at the final class meeting.
- (e) On time participation of the installation and opening of the Master's Exhibition.

The Final Projects Due on Thursday, November 17, 2016:

One ten-page written statement.

One CD/DVD of your artwork, sketches, and all written assignments (The CD/DVD will be kept by the department)
